Conversation

Scared

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Be prayerful and intentional

Ask for God's help to speak for him in an appropriate way and for him to use you to build relationships for his Kingdom

What do you appreciate when people talk to you?

- A welcoming smile
- A greeting
- Appropriate questions
- Not too many personal questions
- Eye contact
- Genuine interest
- Someone who is relaxed
- People who take the initiative and introduce themselves

What about Internationals?

- Talk slowly and clearly. Simplify your English
- Give them time to answer your questions
- Ask them questions as they might not be able to ask you questions
- Tell them a little about yourself
- Ask them about their family
- Be aware of sensitive topics
- Humour?
- Choose neutral topics of conversation e.g. food, customs, places in UK to visit

Creating Conversations

How would you start a conversation with someone you didn't know...



- Sitting in church before the service
- In the mingling area after the service
- Picking your child up from a YP group
- At the bus stop

Continuing Conversations

Ask questions

- Not closed questions (beginning 'are' or 'do') which can be answered yes or no
- Questions starting with 'who' `what', 'where', 'when` are open questions, which need fuller answers
- If you're looking to go a little deeper and develop the conversation further, then try some probing questions starting with words 'how', why' and 'in what way'

Listen to the answers

Developing Conversations



- How might you ask someone if they are a Christian?
- How might you introduce into the conversation that you are a Christian?
- What might you ask someone to find out if they are experiencing any difficulties?

Concluding Conversations

- I've enjoyed meeting (visiting with) you
- It's been lovely to chat with you
- We must meet up and talk again
- Excuse me, I've got to go... I've another appointment in 5 minutes

Following-up Conversations

- Remember details, names and what you have talked about
- Pray for the person you have talked to and for any concerns they may have shared with you
- Make an effort to talk again, picking up on details that have already been shared

Be prayerful and intentional

- Make the most of every opportunity
- Be willing to step out of your comfort zone (circle of comfort)
- Pray and ask God to give you greater love for others, increased boldness to initiate conversations, and the ability to encourage others and be a witness to Christ through your conversations.
